**Generosity Week** This Sunday 25<sup>th</sup> September marks the beginning of Generosity Week, a week for thinking about God's abundant gifts and our response. There will be more information given out at the 10am service including readings and reflections for the week to aid us in our prayer and thinking around the themes of generosity and gratitude. The week will end with our Harvest Festival on Sunday 2<sup>nd</sup> October when we have communion at 10am and our Harvest Hymns and Pimms at 3pm. Please do join us and don't forget to send Qyan your hymn choices!

**Stewardship Sunday 25th September** We will be celebrating the gifts God has given us and thinking about how we might respond to God's generosity. It will also mark the nearest Sunday to the 10th anniversary of my licensing as Vicar and we will be reinstating the chalice for those who wish to drink from the common cup. There will still be the option to receive the bread alone or intincted (dipped) in the wine by a priest or deacon but it is strongly advised that we should not dip our own bread into the wine. We have two new chalices gifted to the church in 2019 as part of the 800th anniversary and we will consecrate them and use them for the first time. **Anthony.**

Harvest Sunday 2nd October This year, we will be supporting the food pantries in the city which opened earlier this year at Wesley Hall Community Centre and All Saints Belgrave. These are run and organised by pantry members and enable people to choose the items they will use, like anyone would in a standard shop, returning the dignity of choice that is often taken away by charitable food provision. By using surplus and/or donated produce, the pantry can provide a shop at a far more affordable price - each member pays £4.50 per visit. It isn't a "full" weekly shop for many families, but



the savings they provide enable members to buy other, often more specialist items (e.g. 'free-from' produce), or items rarely in surplus (e.g. milk) that would otherwise be too expensive.

Food pantries also provide more than food. Toiletries and household cleaning products are often items that people struggling financially sacrifice in order to prioritise food, so food pantries deliberately include non-food items such as these in the items members can choose. A food pantry is also more sustainable for an organisation to set up and finance, as they get a return on food that is bought by members - which in turn funds stock, staff and overheads. However, with the increase in inflation, this is still proving quite a challenge for both All Saints and Wesley Hall. If you would like to support the food pantries financially this week, please put your gift in an envelope marked "Leicester food Pantries".

The food pantries serve their specific local communities. The following items will be particularly appreciated by Wesley Hall: long life milk – oil - rice – lentils - cereals – toiletries. All Saints Belgrave serve a mixed community on a regular basis, so please feel free to donate whatever you are able to. Both food pantries can also receive surplus vegetables from allotments. **Sian.**
