Dear Friends, I've been trying to work out, in the weeks since being ordained, what difference there is in wearing a clerical shirt and collar. I'm an occasional fan of Marvel and DC superhero films and perhaps a small part of me was hoping that 'Captain Dog Collar' would be my new persona, swooping in to save the day. In fact, if anything the reverse has been true, with my wearing of this small plastic insert around my neck merely serving to highlight my own inadequacies and short comings.

This sense of not being equal to the challenge was thrown into sharp relief the other day when I came across a road accident. Upon getting out my car to see what help I could offer, I realised that with no medical skills, there was little I could actually do. Instead of 'swooping to the rescue', I padded around the edges, while others carefully tended to the injured boy and expertly directed traffic until the ambulance and police arrived. I realised that the best thing for me to do was to get out of the way. There was one thing I could do however, and that was to quietly pray.

It's not very likely that many of us have what it takes to be a hero, still less a superhero. Perhaps that's why so many hero stories are works of fiction. By contrast all of us can pray. I was able to pray for the boy, for his parents, for those caring for him and for the skill of the medics that would soon be attending him. In praying we are appealing to the one who has created us all, knows us all and loves us all.

Not being equal to the challenge is the point, and perhaps we should all be grateful that we don't have the power to sort out everything. As Spiderman would say: "With great power comes great responsibility." We may often find ourselves in a position of vulnerability, only to find that God provides. We can pray in times of change, times of anxiety and times of crisis. In those circumstances, no matter how inadequate and unequal to a challenge we may feel, God can make superheroes of us all.
