Readings for today: 2 Timothy 3 vs 14-ch 4 v 5; Luke 18 vs 1-8

Dear Friends, Last weekend, our congregation gathered to celebrate our Patronal Festival, St Denys Day. The amount of food we had brought together for the Parish lunch was amazing. We never have a list for bring and share events but somehow, we always have fabulous food diversity. I also felt incredibly grateful for the way in which we were all sharing fellowship together and it made me reflect on Christian hospitality.

Practising Christian hospitality isn't about glamorous table settings or platters of perfect food; it is about practising servanthood, and loving others through Christ, making people feel special.

Christians recognise hospitality as a spiritual gift. The Bible tells us that every believer is given at least one spiritual gift for the purpose of building up God's church and serving the body of Christ. These spiritual gifts are given not for our own benefit, but for the enrichment of others. Romans 12 encourages us all to practise hospitality, whether it is our spiritual gift or not. "Share with the Lord's people who are in need. Practise hospitality".

In 1 Peter 4:8-10 "Above all, love each other deeply, because love covers over a multitude of sins. Offer hospitality to one another without grumbling. Each of you should use whatever gift you have received to serve others, as faithful stewards of God's grace in its various forms." So, when we love and serve others in the community through hospitality, we are also serving God. When we open our hearts as well as our homes, we are practising Christian hospitality.

Many in the UK and indeed in our own church community, are putting Christian hospitality into action through the Homes for Ukraine scheme and through House Groups. I also hear talk that as the cold winter bites, we hope to be able to use St Denys as a warm space. If so, we all need to think about how we offer Christian hospitality.

Hospitality may be easy for some, and more difficult for others. After all, it is not always easy to give of yourself, but if we can open our doors to the extent that strangers sense loving kindness and genuine concern, then that is the moment when that space, your home, becomes a sanctuary for those God sends your way. With prayer, planning and preparation, God can use people like you and me to touch lives in a personal way. **Kay Smith**
