## Sunday 30th October 2022, 4th Sunday before Advent, All Saints Day



*Readings for Sunday 30th: 2 Thessalonians 1; Luke 19vs 1-10*

Dear Friends

I wonder if you have been enjoying the beautiful Diwali fireworks this week. As the nights draw in, our friends and neighbours of other faiths are sharing in wonderful celebrations of light overcoming darkness.

At church last week Sarah organized our own Light Party for young families. We made lanterns, fruit rockets and joined in with Mark's interactive firefly story. We also made stained glass windows and put them up to let the light shine through.

Jesus called himself the light of the world (John 8.12). Think for a moment about what light does: it challenges the darkness, it brings hope and comfort, it brings warmth and life. All those things are important when we think about the light of Jesus. But Jesus' light also helps us to see ourselves as we are, people who sometimes get it wrong, who make mistakes. At the same time, that light reveals the way forward, a new path for us to embark on with Jesus.

As well as defining himself as light, Jesus also calls us lights: 'You are the light of the world' (Matthew 5.14). Paul takes up this image, applying it to himself, and Barnabas when he preaches to the people of Antioch. 'The Lord has commanded us saying, "I have sent you to be a light for the Gentiles, so that you may bring salvation to the ends of the earth." ' (Acts 13.47). Like the apostles, we are called not simply to gaze at Jesus' light and draw comfort from it, but to receive it in ourselves and let it shine through us to others.

When I see the autumn sun shining through beautiful stained glass windows with images of saints in them, it reminds me that we are all called to be saints, to be followers of Jesus, and that means letting his light of love and hope shine through us into the world.
