Dear Friends,

If you were in church last Sunday or have caught up online, you will know I had a wonderful time on retreat at the Stable House in North Kilworth, so much so I have booked for a group to go for an Epiphany Quiet Day on 7<sup>th</sup> January (see inside!) Taking time to pause and slow down is very much part of how the traditions of Advent encourage us to prepare for Christmas, as difficult as that may be, especially with so many school visits, community carols and services! A good book can help, so do take advantage of the lending library at the back of church ...

One of the things we can easily miss in the traditional Advent readings about John the Baptist is that he didn't come telling people to prepare the way of the Lord in the places of worship of his day. Far from it, he went out into the wilderness, the desert even, as far away from polite society as he could get, a place where there were few signs of life.

Driving into the wilds of Leicestershire, at one point my Sat-Nav lost its signal, and I couldn't work out where I was or where I was meant to go. Thankfully, there is a little compass icon on the screen that re-centres you on the map. I pulled over, re-centred and was soon back on the right road.

Advent is our chance to do just that, to find a quiet spot off the busy highway, re-centre our hearts and lives on God, and only then get back on the road, hopefully with a bit more confidence that we are heading in the right direction.

Finally, if we ourselves are more roadworthy, we might be in a better position to take others along with us for the ride. Who might we invite to join us on our journey through Advent to Christmas? Who has God placed on our hearts that we can be praying for and inviting to come and meet Him?
