
## **ST DENYS CHURCH EVINGTON BULLETIN Sunday** 19th February 2023, Sunday next before Lent

Readings for today: 2 Peter 1 vs 16-end; Matthew 17 vs 1-9



In Paul's letter to the Colossians, he writes about the whole body being "joined and knitted together by every ligament with which it is equipped, as each part is working properly, promotes the body's growth in building itself up in love" (4.16). Watching the terrible scenes from the earthquake zone in Turkey and Syria, I know I have felt the pull of those threads that knit us together as one humanity.

Like it or not, we are bound together. We may violently disagree with one another on all sorts of things but the message from Paul (e.g., Galatians 3.28) is that our unity does not depend on us but on Christ. What that means with regard to our fellow human beings is that we have a responsibility to play our part to help them. Likewise, when it comes to the disagreements in the church, we cannot walk away from one another. We are to "promote the body's growth" and build one another up in love. In knitting terms, we cannot let a stitch drop!

So, what might that look like for us in Evington this week? Are there people we need to work harder to love, people with whom we have fallen out or had a disagreement? How might we go beyond just being civil to positively promote their wellbeing, their growth in faith and love?

If we aren't sure what our part in any of this looks like, Lent (which begins on Ash Wednesday 22<sup>nd</sup> February) is as good a time as any to pray, reflect and seek support with those questions. You might consider joining the Lent course, signing up for the Quiet Day or speaking to one of the staff team, or you might even join the knitters!
