As the Psalmist David says (Psalm 101) "I will sing of your love and justice; to you, O Lord, I will sing praise..."

SAFEGUARDING AT ST. DENYS CHURCH Since I took on this role in 2001 when a policy came out to safeguard children within a church, and to today's extent of vulnerable adults and children increasing considerably, life being a Safeguarding Coordinator expands considerably each year.
