## ST DENYS CHURCH EVINGTON BULLETIN Sunday 28th May 2023, Pentecost with Baptism

Dear Friends, what language or languages do you speak in and what language do the people around you speak in? Of course, we can take this question in a very literal way and in Evington and across Leicester we see English being spoken alongside Gujarati, Punjabi, Polish, Urdu, Somali, Arabic, Bengali, Portuguese, Kurdish, Tamil, Hindi and many, many more. But we can also see this question in terms of what, or how, we more broadly communicate with each other. In amongst the everyday chatter of life and polite communication, what messages are being sent? Perhaps the underlying message we are signalling is that we are friendly and approachable. Perhaps in some cases it can even be the opposite!

On Sunday we celebrate Pentecost, the time that the Holy Spirit was first sent to the disciples of Jesus. In Acts chapter 2 we read of the effects of the Holy Spirit filling each of them as they began to speak in other tongues, as the Spirit enabled them. It describes how a crowd gathered in bewilderment and asked "'Aren't all these who are speaking Galileans? Then how is it that each of us hears them in our native language? Parthians, Medes and Elamites; residents of Mesopotamia, Judea and Cappadocia, Pontus and Asia," (Acts 2:7-9) Consequently the disciples were to go on to prophesy and perform amazing acts in the Spirit.

If such wonders and signs are feeling a bit beyond us this Pentecost, then perhaps it is a prompt that we need to renew our own prayers to be filled afresh ourselves? Equally we should remind ourselves that the Holy Spirit isn't some vague warm fuzzy feeling to make us feel good about ourselves, but is rather more tangible, producing what Paul describes as the fruits of the Spirit namely: love, joy, peace, forbearance, kindness, gentleness, and self-control. (Galatians 5.22-23)

In communicating with all people regardless of language, culture, or religion this is something we can all bear in mind as we talk with our neighbours. Just as God shows us his abundant love, so we can show love and joy in the Spirit to all those around us in turn. It may come out in what we say or in what we do, but in everything, we can reflect the great love that Jesus gave to us. Now that is a language worth receiving!

A Message from One Roof Leicester following the recent consultation about repurposing the former youth club in St Denys car park:

Unfortunately, based on the level of strong opposition against the proposal, the trustees of One Roof Leicester

and the Diocese of Leicester's Glebe Committee have decided not to proceed with the project for modular homes on this site.

The decision has been a difficult one as there is a serious shortage of accommodation in Leicester for single people who have been homeless. But we felt the opposition to the project meant the site would not be conducive to the wellbeing and stability of our residents.
