Dear Friends, I would suggest that quite often, we all experience feelings of anxiety, worry, even anger about different things going on in our lives and in that which we observe in others. We find it difficult to see how issues and problems will be resolved. We try to battle on in our own strength, perhaps because we don't want to burden other people, or we see it as none of their business! So, the pressure grows and one's wellbeing is negatively impacted. Of course, it is natural to feel these emotions, after all, we are human, and I confess to having those feelings quite a bit of late.

For example, walking in London from Victoria to Westminster and back, twice each week, I see the same people who are homeless, most of them in a quite a state, and I have begun to take notice and be concerned quite a bit more than before – I ask myself, is anything going to be done to help them? Concerns about my elderly father and the care me and two of my sisters give to him, emerging issues with my own health and the impact it may have on my work and interests, anger, and irritation about the attitudes some people have on various issues both locally, in the church locally and nationally, in politics, privately too relating to siblings - the list goes on!

Bob Marley and the Wailers once sang that famous song "Don't worry about a thing, cos every little thing is gonna be alright..." Of course, the ability to apply that fully in our lives is nigh on impossible for all of us!

What amazes me when I think about it, and I include myself in this, is that we often fail and forget to turn to the very one who can help us and the one in whom we, as Christians, profess to believe in and commit our lives to – our Lord and Saviour Jesus Christ. In effect, we abandon him! It was he who said, "Come unto me all ye who are heavy laden, and I will give you rest." We need to learn to fully trust in him, the only one who can help us, and give us the strength and confidence to manage and deal with things in his way, the right way, guiding and protecting us.

As the songwriters Stuart Townend and Keith Getty put it: 'In Christ alone, my hope is found, he is my light, my strength, my song; this cornerstone, this solid ground, firm through the fiercest drought and storm.' May this indeed, be our full belief and action, for all time, not just in times of wor1⁴y, distress and difficulty. Blessings, **Qyan**
