ST DENYS CHURCH EVINGTON, BULLETIN Sunday 23rd July 2023, Seventh Sunday after Trinity





Readings for Sunday: Romans 8 vs 12-25, Matthew 13 vs 24-30, 36-43

Dear Friends, July and August are often when we rest - as a society, we have school "summer holidays", and in times past Leicester used to have a specific fortnight when the factories took a break. Many will be jetting off to warmer climes, or trying to get away within the UK, to stop their usual pattern of work and take a break, physically and mentally. Rest is essential for us physically, mentally, emotionally and spiritually - that's why God commanded His people to keep the Sabbath!

Jesus says: "Come to me, all you who are weary and burdened, and I will give you rest." Are you weary and burdened, tired physically, emotionally or spiritually, or burned out? Jesus invites you to come to Him for rest. What does this rest look like? Our world, society, and even our own inclinations often tell us that we aren't "doing enough" to succeed in our work, home life, and our responsibilities, or perhaps even in our church ministry and service. In our faith journey, this can be expressed as feeling like we are not "doing enough" to worship, pray, study the Bible or draw close to God. I haven't yet met one person who is immune to this, and it's something that I have to repeatedly check within myself (with varying degrees of success!)

The rest Jesus offers us is "rest for your soul", a rest that comes not from stopping activity, ministry or service out right, but by laying down the burdens we have been carrying and instead taking Jesus' yoke upon our shoulders. As I've pondered on this I realised that, very often, whilst many of the things we do are applaudable, and many are ones we feel are essential, it's easy for us to get distracted by the clamour and shouts of pressing "issues" around us, rather than pausing to listen to what it is that Jesus wants us to do.

Over the next two weeks, I am taking some time to rest physically, emotionally and mentally, and then to rest spiritually by going the Christian New Wine summer conference. During this time, I want to seek out Jesus' voice again, and lay my burdens down, so that I am able to do the tasks that Jesus asks of me. I invite you to take the opportunity this summer, wherever you may be, to do the same. With love and prayers, **Sian**


