Dear Friends, If you were in church last Sunday, you will have





the experience of going to the youth festival 'Satellites' last week. Across five days, three thousand young people and their leaders gathered twice a day in the Bath and West Showground 'cow shed' for 1 and ¾ hours of joyful and vibrant worship. In between there were seminars and activities to keep everyone busy and engaged from dawn to dusk. During the week we had the highs of worshipping, bible study, eating and spending time with each other as a joint St. Denys and St. Paul's church team but also, we had to contend with rain and wind so strong it threatened to blow the tents away! As for the toilets -let's not go there! Overall though, the whole experience of being together with so many young Christians, and seeing so many be called to follow Jesus while they were at Satellites was a huge encouragement for all of us.

As we meet for worship each Sunday and Thursday, I hope that we find our times together just as encouraging. At Satellites I was so impressed by the commitment shown by our young people in attending just about everything that they possibly could! As a result, they got the most out of their time together. This week and next week at St. Denys we offer Morning prayer on Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday, and Thursdays at 9.00am (and communion on Thursday at 10.00am as part of open church). On Sunday we have our main communion service at 10.00am (which can also be joined on Zoom). Then on the Sunday afternoon the church is open from 3-4pm to drop in, chat and pray. Sunday evening at 6.00pm we have Evensong and then following this we can meet at the Cedars pub for a drink and a chat. Let us all be as encouraged in our attendance as our young people. If you can attend these times of worship and fellowship, then I will look forward to seeing you there!

We also share a responsibility in the discipling and encouragement of young people to faith throughout our community. It would be wonderful to hear stories about how we have engaged with and encouraged young people whom we meet. It would also be great to hear how young people are being invited to our youth events or given encouragements of prayer at exam times. These are just some of the small things we can all do to ensure the good news and love that Jesus brings continues to be known amongst all people.
