Dear Friends, we live in an incredibly dangerous world, where war and strife has been prevalent for generations and is massively increasing, and natural disasters are occurring much more. These conflicts and disasters are with us, here and now, not some far away universe in which we have no part! Whether it be the current conflicts in Ukraine, or Palestine and Israel and elsewhere, any right-minded individual must worry greatly for our world when we note the evil actions of aggressors, where innocent people are always the ones to suffer most. The heart breaking and terrible scenes of destruction, not just to property but far more importantly, to human life is deeply upsetting. We can legitimately ask; how can our fellow human beings be so inhumane to one another? It

is almost incomprehensible but entirely due to mankind's sinful ways.

Here we are in the 21st century, technology advancing at a rapid rate, to be used for bad, as well as good – artificial intelligence is one example - the world's Western leaders twitching, not always knowing what to do for the best, in case their actions inflame already desperate situations and make them worse and other world leaders wanting that to happen for their own political and very questionable ends.

As Christians, none of this should be new to us! We believe that the Bible is the holy word of God, our truth, our hope, relevant to today even more now, than we might have thought before. We shouldn't be surprised by the world's troubles and the truth is that much of the last 2000 years has been marked by events such as those Jesus described to his disciples on the Mount of Olives (Matthew 24 verses 6-13): "...you will hear of wars and rumours of wars...such things must happen, but the end is still to come...there will be famines and earthquakes in various areas...at that time many will turn away from the faith and hate each other and many false prophets will appear and deceive many people..." all this is happening now, again, in our lifetimes!

Writing after the 2nd world war, but equally applicable today, the Christian writer, speaker and concentration camp survivor Corrie ten Boom said "We are not a post war generation; but a pre-peace generation. Jesus is coming." Having Jesus as our Lord and Saviour, as we profess publicly in church every Sunday by saying the words of the creed, we can look forward to the end times, when Christ's glorious second coming will see heaven on earth for all those who have been faithful to him. In the meantime, exercise the one powerful weapon you do have - prayer. Pray for the world, with all its tragedy and despair and an end to man's inhumanity to man, and earnestly seek Christ's return! At the beginning of November, on <u>Sunday 5th at 10am</u>, the service will be Holy Communion, not Matins.


