Readings for today: Ephesians 1 vs 15-end; Matthew 25 vs 31-end

Dear Friends, A couple of weekends ago, I spent the Saturday with a group of Christian young adult friends. We had an extended time of worship with a couple of talks/sermons from members of the group, some free time, and a prayer space where each person's face was on the wall, so we could pray for one another by name and write on it, any words from God, Bible verses or personal encouragements.

One of the talks was from a friend who, like me, has had a lot of health issues in the past year. There were lots of good things in what she said, but I want to share one with you, a quote from St Denys' favourite fantasy land - Narnia!

In the Magician's Nephew, Polly and Digory witness Aslan singing Narnia into being, and yet, even before that is complete, they have inadvertently, brought evil into the new world, from a "dying" other world - the Queen of Charn, who later returns as the White Witch. To protect Narnia, Aslan sends Digory on a mission to collect some fruit from a special tree. All Digory wants to do is find something that will cure his dying Mother, and had thought about bargaining with Aslan, but realised that wasn't a good idea. Having said "Yes" he is then desperate and begs Aslan for something that will cure his Mother. Then he looks up at Aslan's face:

"What he saw surprised him as much as anything in his whole life. For the tawny face was bent down near his own and (wonder of wonders) great shining tears stood in the Lion's eyes. They were such big, bright tears compared with Digory's own that for a moment he felt as if the Lion must really be sorrier about his mother than he was himself."

This image of Aslan, representing God, caring about our griefs even more than we do ourselves is a powerful one which we find repeated throughout the Bible, from Jesus weeping at Lazarus' tomb, to prophecies of Jesus taking up our suffering and bearing our pain (Isaiah 53), of "the LORD being close to the broken-hearted" (Ps 34:18).

God knows our suffering and shares our pain and grief, for ourselves or those we love. He carries us amid that pain and suffering, comforting and sustaining us, and we know that we have the ultimate hope - of eternity in God's holy city, with God in the midst of us, with no more crying, no more pain, no more death (Rev 22). Let's hold onto that hope today. With love and prayets, **Sian**


