Readings for today: Isaiah 61 vs 1-4, 8-end; John 1 vs 6-8, 19-28

Dear Friends, the idea of Advent runs counter to the way in which most people fill this time of year with eating, drinking, shopping and forced jollity ... it's not easy trying to be penitential when you have to don your Christmas jumper for every school visit and sing carols in your sleep! Thankfully this week is Gaudete Sunday (or pink candle Sunday!) and we get to lighten the mood a little and think about joy.

But let us also remember that not everyone feels jolly at this time of year... On Tuesday I marked the 10th anniversary since my brother's sudden death aged just 38. Many of you walked with me and prayed for me through that incredibly difficult time, and, like me, you may find it hard to believe it was 10 years ago! Taking the time to visit his grave with my mum, look at photos and shed some tears was something I needed to do this week away from all the festive madness.

Of course, I am not alone in missing someone at Christmas. I am sure many of us do. There is a poignancy to this season. Tears flow as we sing at carol services, or we suddenly notice the empty chair at Christmas dinner. I want to say that it is ok to miss someone at this time of year, however long ago they left us. And maybe, like me, you will need to take time to remember, perhaps light a candle for them on Christmas day.

"The light shines in the darkness and the darkness did not overcome it" (John 1.5) – words we hear read at the midnight communion on Christmas Eve. While we may need space to acknowledge the darkness, we also turn our faces to the light that is coming into the world. My brother loved everything about Christmas, so it was a fitting end to the day of his anniversary to put up the Christmas tree and smother it in tinsel and baubles. Even so, I may still have shed a tear as we turned on the lights...

However you are feeling as we approach this Christmas, may you know the peace and blessing of the Christ child. **Anthony**
