These visits have brought much joy but equally, at times, great uncertainty and I have been indebted to the wonderful team of people who have helped, facilitated, and led these visits. Sometimes signing up to be part of a team like this can lead us to unexpected places. This was especially true of our final visit from Oaklands special school.

We had all arrived in good time at church to receive the children. We had prepared and planned, everyone was briefed and ready. A 'stable' had been set up, we had numerous costumes, a route planned for our 'journey' to Bethlehem. All was ready. Then with just minutes to go, we received a message: 'it was too wet and rainy, the trip was cancelled.' All our effort was in vain. In many ways I was quite relieved, it had already been a busy morning, perhaps it was time for tea and a biscuit? Obviously, it was quite disappointing, but...

...But then one of our team suggested something that changed everything. 'What if we go and take all this to them instead?' Well of course by now I was thinking about my well-earned custard cream. I raised an eyebrow at this apparent madness... but the team seemed to agree and of course, she was right. After a quick phone call back, we were told that the children would love this! We gathered all our carefully set out props together in a bin bag, piled into two cars and took the Christmas story to them instead.

It was a very different presentation to the one we had planned, much better in the circumstances. The children had a great time with smiles all around and so too did we! It was an experience that I think we will all remember for some time to come.

Let us remember this Christmas that Jesus was born as the biggest disruption possible to a narrative of human failure and sin. With his birth we have all been invited in joining him in building the Kingdom of God. Being part of that sometimes involves us in saying yes to the disruptions that God puts in our way, and this can be scary at times. But if we are brave enough to trust in him then it can have some amazing and unforeseen outcomes.

This Christmas let's not be worried if our preparations are interrupted. Instead let us ask how Jesus would want us to celebrate his birth, then be open to the answers we may get and the places it may lead us to. Avery happy Christmas to you all. **Mark**
