Readings for today: Revelation 5 vs 1-10; ; John 1 vs 43-end

Dear Friends, at this time of year, someone always asks me "have you made any New Year resolutions?". For most people, I suspect they mean very little except becoming a source of guilt and triggering a sense of failure - every year, we list our key ambitions, commitments and promises for ourselves or another, and then quite quickly break those commitments and promises, and the hoped for achievements seem like wishful imaginations!

This approach to the future and our "plans" for the coming year don't sit very well with the Christian faith. It is God who knows all our days (Psalm 139), it is God who has plans and purposes for us, who has begun a good work in us and will carry it on to completion (Philippians 1:6). A friend sent me the guideline of a prayer session from 24/7 prayer, a way of giving thanks for the year that has just passed, dreaming of the year ahead and then seeking God's perspective on those dreams. As we look back on the previous year, instead of berating ourselves for our failure to achieve things that we imagined we might be able to do that year, we are encouraged to reflect and remember with joy and give thanks for the ways in which we have seen God's goodness this year. Some of you, like me, will have had a difficult year just past. This isn't about ignoring those difficulties, but rather seeking out, and giving thanks, for God's goodness in the middle of them, "for God is good, and His love endures forever" (Psalm 107:1).

When we know what we dream for the future, what we imagine it to look like, what we want to ask for, we can then bring those dreams to the One "who is able to do immeasurably more than all we ask or imagine, according to his power that is at work within us" (Ephesians 3:20), and surrender our ideas, dreams and visions to His, "committing our way to Him" as Psalm 37:5 instructs us, and trusting in His goodness.


