Readings for today: 10am: Colossians 1 vs 15-20; John 1 vs 1-14

Dear Friends, It was great to be back at the Stable House in North Kilworth for 24 hours last week and I am really looking forward to our day there together on 10th Feb when we will be thinking about the Transfiguration story (Mark 9) before diving into Lent.

Along with having a good chat with Stanley the donkey, I took myself off for a prayer walk down into the woods. The red kites were circling up above me in the clear blue sky and it was a beautiful afternoon. I turned a corner and came out into a clearing with a pile of dead wood. Above it, to my amazement, was a crowd of tiny faeries dancing in the sunlight. No, the vicar hasn't started hallucinating! They were in fact winter gnats lekking (the males showing off to their potential mates ...) but the beauty of the scene caught my imagination and I saw something else, something magical, a picture that will stay with me for a long time.

When Peter, James and John went up the mountain with Jesus, they were treated to the most wondrous sight that captured their whole imagination. The scene was seared into their memories and inspired them long after the event took place. It was a moment that opened their eyes to God's eternal perspective and his presence and purposes in Jesus Christ.

Echoing Paul in Ephesians 1.18, St Augustine wrote that "the whole business of our life is to restore sight to the eye of the heart whereby God can be seen." There is much in our world and maybe in our own lives that we would rather not face and see right now. Not many of us would want to look too closely at a bunch of gnats either! But what if we paused, took a deep breath, and asked God to open the eyes of our hearts so that we might see something else, his miraculous gift of hope perhaps, something joyous and life-giving even in the midst of pain and struggle.


Personal Prayer If you would like/need personal prayer after any service in church, please speak privately to any member of the Ministry Team present, and they will be very glad to pray with and/or for you.
