Readings for today: 1 Samuel 1 vs20—end; John 19 vs 25b-27

Dear Friends, a theme that keeps cropping up this Lent, is love – God's amazing love for us; His faithful, never changing love; and our love for God and for our neighbour. Not surprising, really, that our thoughts keep turning to love, as God is love. We love God in response to Him, to His love for us. He has loved us from the beginning, knowing us before we were born. It was He who created us; He formed us, knit us together, as we read in that beautiful Psalm, 139. And in Lent, as we reflect on our life, our relationship with God, so it is a time to seek to draw closer to Him; seeking His will for our lives, whatever stage we may be at in our life and in our journey of faith.

There may be times when we do not feel close to God. But again, as we are reminded by the Psalmist, there is nowhere that we can go, to be out of God's presence. Whether it feels that God is close or not, we need to remember that promise of Jesus, in the closing words of St Matthew's Gospel, that he is with us, always. All around us, we see signs of God's love for us, and for the world, in and through His works of creation. This is a beautiful time of year, with all the flowering bulbs, the blossom, all the new life bursting forth.

This Sunday is Mothering Sunday; a day to remember and give thanks, especially for our mothers, but also our families, those who love us, care for us; those whom we love; and also, to give thanks for the Mother Church. For some people, the day will have a tinge of sadness to it, remembering those whom we love but see no more. But we can still give thanks, for those relationships, for all the love shared; for all they have meant to us.

Let us thank God for love, and that He is love.

Love in abundance. God's love is all around us. Open your eyes, see.
