## ST DENYS CHURCH EVINGTON, BULLETIN Sunday 17th March 2024, 5th Sunday of Lent, Passiontide begins





Dear Friends, when my children were young, one of our favourite programmes to watch alongside each other, was called 'Something Special' with Mr. Tumble on the CBeebies channel. A feature of the show was its use of Makaton signing; a simple introductory signing system that it brought into the daily lives of children. We used to love going around the house mimicking what we had learned, signing messages to each other, such as "I see you" or rather more randomly "look, a cow."

Visiting Oaklands, the special school in our own parish this week, I was able to brush up on some Makaton in preparation, though this time these signs were more specific to Easter. When you visit a school like Oaklands you realise that there are lots of different ways we can communicate beyond just the spoken or written word. Even simply standing close or distant to someone sends important messages. The children communicate in ways that come naturally to them, that involve the use of the whole self, ways that, as adults, we often forget about or neglect to develop in ourselves.

How do we communicate our faith to each other? Until I studied theology, I always felt a slight sense of inadequacy in communicating the Gospel to anyone. During study, I understood that the more I learnt the more I recognised how little I knew. Feeling inadequate in this area was going to be a permanent experience! It doesn't have to be this way because God's message is simple; of how much he loves us all. As followers of Jesus, we don't need fancy words or complicated arguments to communicate this. Instead, we need to let this fundamental truth find a home within us and then reflect it back to others with the wholeness of ourselves. I'm not sure how easy it is to express the Gospel in Makaton, but I do know that reflecting God's love is something we can do with our whole body and with our whole life. It comes out in acts of kindness and patient duty, it can seep out of all that we are and do.

As we think about how we can share the love of God with our neighbours this Easter, it may be time to reconnect with ways of communicating that involve the wholeness of ourselves. In doing so, we can be involved in sharing how special it is to be loved by the God who made us, just as we are. With Every Blessing, **Mark**

Would you be interested in taking part in a study into footwear within the General Hospital? The study is looking to recruit people with either type 1 or 2 diabetes aged 18-80 years old with some loss of sensation in their feet (for example, cold/numb feet or feet that are painful/tingling etc.) The study

involves two visits to the diabetes centre with up to £10 travel and/or parking expenses provided for each visit. Two out of three participants are able to retain their custom-made footwear as a thank you for taking part, which is looking at how footwear fit guidelines affect pressures and temperature of feet, in people with diabetes.
