Dear Friends, Easter, for many, is a difficult time. We are asked to believe something we cannot explain and certainly cannot prove or disprove. The idea that someone rose from the dead is, for some

people, ridiculous. Some will dismiss it as nonsense, while others may try to cope with it by watering it down a bit. They might say that the spirit of Jesus rose from the dead even though his body stayed in the grave. Others may say that he lives on in his followers, as they try to continue his work and complete his aims.

These ideas start with the difficulty of believing and are an attempt to produce something more acceptable so that it will not be so hard to believe. We do well to be suspicious of such a process. If God is what we say he is, all powerful and totally beyond our understanding, we should be careful about trying to slim him down to fit our brains. It is wrong to equate what we can understand with what is possible.

We cannot prove it. It would be a lesser thing if we could because it would be something we could contain within our minds. This does not mean that there is no evidence for the Resurrection as some would believe for it is difficult to understand the survival and indeed the growth of the Church over the centuries if there was no real foundation for it. There continues to be as ever, simply millions of people whose lives have been changed because they came to believe in the Resurrection.

Perhaps instead of wondering how we can cut down this belief to a more acceptable size, we should be asking a different question. Have we really realised how great and awesome this thing is? Belief in the Resurrection is not just belief in something that happened 2000 years ago in Jerusalem. It is believing in a living God who is present and active in our lives, that ultimately God is greater than evil and that his purposes will one day be achieved and that we are always able to experience our resurrection through repentance and forgiveness.

The Resurrection isn't just historic, it is an insight into the nature of God and his purpose for the world. It represents the basic reason why Christians believe it is possible to live together in this world with hope, despite all the troubles which surround us in the world.

Wishing you all joy and hope in believing in the Risen Christ, for... ... Alleluia! Christ is Risen. He is Risen indeed. Alleluia!
