## ST DENYS CHURCH EVINGTON, BULLETIN Sunday 12th May 2024, 7th Sunday of Easter





Readings for today: Acts 1 vs 15-17, 21-end; John 17 vs 6-19

Dear Friends,

Thursday, Ascension Day, when we celebrate Jesus returning to heaven, to his Father, his own work on earth complete: 'It is finished!' And now, a time of waiting.

Looking at the accounts of the Ascension:

At the end of St Matthew's gospel, it is just implied that Jesus is leaving, as we read how Jesus commanded the disciples to 'make disciples of all nations'; and we have the wonderful promise that Jesus is always with us.

At the end of St Luke's gospel, we read final words and instructions of Jesus to the disciples; here, this included telling them to wait in Jerusalem until they had received power. Then Jesus was taken up to heaven. The disciples returned to Jerusalem, full of joy.

At the start of Luke's second book, the Acts of the Apostles, we have another account of the Ascension. Again, the instruction to the disciples to wait. Jesus promised they would receive the gift of the Holy Spirit, in just a few days' time; and they would be his witnesses throughout the world. Then Jesus ascended to heaven. As the disciples waited, together with some of the women, including Mary, the mother of Jesus, and the brothers of Jesus, they spent much of their time in prayer.

Today, we are encouraged to spend extra time in prayer, in these days of waiting, from Ascension to Pentecost. I hope you have copies of the 'Thy Kingdom come' resources - the Novena and Prayer Journal - to use in this waiting time; if not, there are still some in church.

As we celebrate Ascension Day, perhaps by joining in our service of Holy Communion in the morning; maybe having something 'bubbly' (the bubbles rising, reminding us of Jesus going up to heaven!). However we celebrate, may we take extra time, in prayer, as we wait to celebrate again, the coming of the Holy Spirit at

Pentecost. And, like the first disciples, may we be filled with joy. **Geraldine**
