Readings for today: Acts 2 vs 1-21; John 15 vs 26-27, ch 16 vs 4b-15

Dear Friends,

Pentecost is often thought of as the birthday of the Church, when we remember the Holy Spirit coming upon the first followers of Jesus with fire and wind and amazing linguistic gifts. As a result, literally thousands were baptised (Acts 2.41). What a wonderful birthday to celebrate!

This year Pentecost just so happens to coincide with my own birthday the day before. I hope it isn't just me, but I've occasionally wondered whether I really want to celebrate getting older, as each year I lose more hair, my joints start to creak, and it seems to take me longer to get up in the morning ...

The Church too may appear to be getting more frail and more fractious with age, especially when we compare our experience in the West today with dramatic stories such as that in Acts 2. Could it be that our hearing and our eyesight aren't what they used to be? Our ability to dance for joy or run the race set before us hampered now by our weak knees and arthritic hands?

In other parts of the world, however, the Church is growing fast, and growing younger, just as we pray it will here. And thanks to the gift of the Spirit at Pentecost, we have "a treasure in clay jars", as Paul reminds us in 2 Corinthians 4, and "so we do not lose heart. Even though our outer nature is wasting away, our inner nature is being renewed day by day." (2 Cor 4.16)

I've often said there must be something in the water in Evington as I've met so many fit and active folk in their nineties and beyond! When I ask if there is a secret, it is usually more about growing a thankful heart than sticking to a special diet or routine.

In the end, I do want to celebrate my birthday, just as I want to celebrate Pentecost, because I want give thanks for the amazing things God has done for me in the past 47 years. Not only that but I also want to give thanks for the promise of all that he will do in the coming year by the grace and power of his Holy Spirit.
