Readings for today: Romans 8 vs 12-17; John 3 vs 1-17

Dear Friends, I have just got back from a fabulous couple of weeks in Victoria, Vancouver Island, and I've just about recovered from the jet lag! There were spectacular views & unique flora a fauna - my favourite being the Arbuthnot trees, which shed their bark each year to leave a smooth 'skin' which starts off a vibrant red before gradually darkening to a rusty-brown.

It was also wonderful to spend quality time with my closest friend and her husband, whether that was visiting a specific site, just wandering around Victoria, going to church, or sharing food with them at home.

It's an experience that has given me much to thank God for and has particularly reminded me of the importance of relationships and quality time spent with one another. What would you thank God for, this week?

This Sunday is Trinity Sunday, a day when we particularly consider the significance of worshipping a God who is Three Persons and One God. It's a concept that is beyond our full understanding, beyond language and explanation. I'm not going to try to explain it, now or in my sermon(!), instead I'd encourage you to focus on the difference it makes that God IS both three persons and One God. The Trinity is intrinsically relational - we cannot remove relationships from God, it is part of who God is. Here are some thoughts & questions to help you ponder this:

- God chooses to have, and to restore, relationship with us, even though the Father, Son & Holy Spirit have relationship within each other. Let this fill you with awe, that God chooses us, and chooses you. Thank God for this
- How does the Spirit help you in relationship with the Father and the Son?
- In John 3, Jesus likens the movement of the Spirit to the wind. We see the effects of the Spirit at work around us. Where have you seen the Holy Spirit at work around you recently? With lo∜e and prayers, **Sian**
