Dear Friends, 'Thank you' is a phrase we say and hear multiple times in a day, 'thank you for holding the door', 'thank you for the cup of tea'.... But I wonder how often we say thank you to God.

James 1:17

Every good and perfect gift is from above, coming down from the Father of the heavenly lights, who does not change like shifting shadows.

When we give thanks to God, we are not just being polite, but acknowledging that all good things come from God. Even in the most testing of circumstances, giving thanks to God can help us to see the good through the bad, and allows us to count our blessings.

In my sermon on Sunday, I shared this reading **Colossians 3 vs 12 - 17**. The final verse of which says:

And whatever you do or say, do it as a representative of the Lord Jesus, giving thanks through him to God the Father.

This passage was read by my godmother at my wedding. She sadly died last week, and I have been feeling very mixed emotions through all parts of the spectrum; from heartbroken to grateful. My godmother gave me the greatest gift that anyone could ever give - faith! Without this I wouldn't be where I am today. It is this faith that helps me to appreciate the times we had together, and the knowledge that she is with the Lord now is of great comfort to me.

In a different form of giving thanks, I will be at the King Power stadium on Saturday to see Leicester City receive their championship trophy! The season has had its highs and lows, like much of life, but I am thankful that we are now going back into the Premier League, albeit with an uncertain financial future ahead of us.

So, this week I would encourage you to spend some time in prayer, thanking God and counting your blessings. **Kimberley**


