ST DENYS CHURCH EVINGTON, BULLETIN 23rd June 2024, Fourth Sunday after Trinity

Readings for today: 2 Corinthians 6 vs 1-13; Mark 4 vs 35-end

Dear Friends, parting company permanently, in any situation, can be very hard and emotional! On Wednesday last, the Journey in Faith (JiF) course which had been running for the last academic year in the parish centre, came to an end. The group has always got on very well and importantly, respected each other's viewpoints whether we have agreed with them or not. There has been throughout, a strong sense of friendship, bonding and fellowship together. This has in no small part, been enabled by our facilitators Revds Anthony and Mark, assisted by Geraldine and Kimberley, all of whom have been excellent!

I know that all who attended would agree that it has been very interesting and challenging at times. It was meant to be! We have dealt with difficult aspects and topics of the Christian life, explored different facets of the bible and Christian thought and traditions, and listened to, and learned a lot, from each other's experiences and opinions.

As we got towards the end of the session, we were each asked to write down anonymously, on 3 pieces of paper, one blessing, challenge and hope that we have in our faith, because of being on the Jif course. Each group of three were then placed around a candle and in silence - an important part of any faith journey - we individually moved around the table to read the responses as the candles flickered, many of which I was very moved by. Anthony then read a poem called 'Blessing for the Traveller' by John O'Donohue, about parting and going our separate ways which not only was pertinent to this session, but also made me think of his and Wendy and family's imminent departure from St. Denys! Again, I had a lump in my throat and a tear in my eye! The final act was to share the grace together whilst holding hands stood in a circle, which re-emphasised the bond we all felt with each other in God's blessing.

In your Christian journey, how are you getting on? What challenges, blessings and hopes do you have as you journey on in your faith and in God's kingdom? Are you open enough to learn from other Christians around you and those of different faiths? Do you desire to learn more, develop your faith and grow as a disciple of Christ, rather than just merely plod on day to day?

I believe the diocese is planning to run the JiF course again. I had my doubts at the start about whether it would be worth attending. Having done so, I can heartily recommend it! With every blessing, **Qyan**
