Dear Friends

I probably don't need to make a list of all the things that could be getting us down recently, so I won't. But as I prepared for a couple of weeks of multiple funerals, I kept being struck by one line in the funeral liturgy that encouraged me, namely "turn the darkness of death into the dawn of new life." And in that one line I was reminded of how our whole faith is founded on the reality, that just when all seemed lost with the death of Jesus on the cross, actually a great victory had been scored.

So, on Monday, after another day of too many hours looking down, tapping away at a keyboard without enough of a break, I decided to abandon my computer and go out into the cooling night air and look upwards for a change. I was encouraged by an article that it was the peak of the Perseid meteor shower and that a coronal mass ejection combining with clear skies could even make a view of the northern lights a possibility.

Well, after a while of watching, duty called me back inside, and in terms of my main quest I had of course been unsuccessful. But actually, I felt strangely lifted. I may not have seen what I had hoped for, but I had felt the cooling breeze, seen a mysterious moon and noticed just how many stars there are to be seen, despite the streetlights. It was a reminder to me that when things seem darkest that's simply because we are not looking to God. Because when we do we notice all the amazing blessings of his creation and that is enough to change everything.

So, if, like me, things have been getting you down a bit recently, make sure you look up. Not necessarily literally, but rather look to God in everything you do, for he is the one who transforms everything, even turning the darkness of death into the dawn of new life.

On Thursday last I (Qyan) had the privilege of playing the organ at St. Peter's Church, Highfields, for a Memorial service for an Afro Caribbean lady. One of the hymns we sang, known to me but not in the St. Denys hymn book, is called 'When Peace Like a River (It is well with My Soul)' Based on Psalm 42 v 11. The words are rather poignant, having been written by Horatio G Spafford in 1873, immediately following a tragic shipping accident in which he survived, but his wife and children died. The tune was composed by Philip P. Bliss in 1876. The words also link, to Revd Mark's letter in this bulletin!

It is well worth listening to on You Tube or some other platform/recording you may be able to access:

- 1. When peace like a river, attendeth my way, when sorrows like sea billows roll, whatever my lot, Thou has taught me to say, "It is well, it is well with my soul." **Refrain:** It is well, it is well, with my soul, with my soul, It is well, it is well with my soul.
- 2. Though Satan should buffet, though trials should come, let this blest assurance control: that Christ has regarded my helpless estate, and has shed His own blood for my soul. **Sing Refrain**
- 3. My sin oh, the bliss of this glorious thought! My sin, not in part, but the whole, is nailed to the cross, and I bear it no more; praise the Lord, praise the Lord, O my soul. **Sing Refrain**
- 4. And Lord, haste the day when my faith shall be sight, the clouds be rolled back as a scroll; the trump shall re-sound and the Lord shall descend; even so, it is well with my soul. **Sing Refrain**
