## ST DENYS CHURCH EVINGTON, BULLETIN Sunday 1st September 2024, 14th Sunday after Trinity

Dear Friends, I spent last weekend camping at a Christian festival. It was wet and VERY windy! Despite this, I am so glad I went! It was wonderful to be able to worship God with 6000 other Christians.



One of the seminars I went to was called "Total Forgiveness". I found this seminar really powerful. The thing with forgiveness is that the common phrase "forgive and forget" is nonsense and is dangerous spiritually, emotionally, and sometimes physically. And yet, we know that Jesus commanded us to forgive, so we try to forgive, and very often we find it very difficult. We may manage to let go of some bitterness and anger, but it has a tendency to rear it's head when we least expect it!

RT Kendall shared his own experience of trying to forgive. Having been badly hurt, he shared this with a friend, expecting them to agree with his anger. Instead, they said "RT, you must TOTALLY FORGIVE, or you will never be free!" So RT began the lifelong process of **totally** forgiving those who had hurt him. Through Joseph's story, RT offered 6 "proofs" to help us reflect on whether we have totally forgiven those who had hurt us. They are:

- 1) Confide ONLY to Jesus: you don't tell anyone what \*they\* did, except:
- a) telling 1 person for counselling
- b) reporting a crime

When Joseph's brothers came asking for grain, he sent everyone else away, before identifying himself. No-one else knew what the brothers had done to him.

- 2) You don't let THEM be afraid of you. Perfect love casts out fear. Love keeps no record of wrongs!
- Joseph invites the brothers to come close to him, assuring them that there is nothing to be afraid of.
- 3) You don't even WANT THEM to feel guilty!
- 4) You let THEM save face cover for them. "God did it!" *Joseph focuses on how God "intended it for good".*
- 5) You protect them from their darkest secret rewrite the story Joseph gives them the words to use, focusing on the good God brought from those events, rather than highlighting the lie.
- 6) You pray for them, daily, asking God to bless them. With love and prayers. Sian

Names in Lights at St. Denys! We are nearly there! Thanks to people's generosity, we now have sufficient funds to carry out the work of installing lights alongside the paths in the church-yard.

At the PCC meeting in June, we considered quotes from three contractors. We chose MV Installations to carry out the work. Since then, we have been working hard with the Diocese to prepare our submission to the Church of England Chancellery for a Faculty - permission to carry out the work. This is a long process all churches need to complete when planning new work.

We need to consider the impact of the lights on the environment, the church buildings and our neighbours. In addition, we had to consider the possibility of needing planning permission.

I am pleased to say that last week we received notification from the Diocese that they were happy for us to continue with our submission to the Chanceller. This was done earlier this week.

We are hopeful for a positive outcome that will enable us to start work before the clocks go back in October. Further updates will be given in future bulletins.
