Dear Friends, Change is a word I seem to be hearing a lot lately. Changes, such as moving home, changing jobs or losing a loved one can stir up our emotions and feelings. It is inevitable that with Anthony leaving, we may be feeling a sense of loss and apprehension about the changes which may happen. I would like to offer some reassurance that however you feel, is perfectly normal and natural, it is important to remember that Christ is with all of us.

Last weekend I was in London, where I was lucky enough to visit Wimbledon for the tennis doubles semi-finals, the Ritz for afternoon tea, and finally seeing Abba Voyage. Throughout my time in London, I was reliant on the train and tube services. There was lots of engineering work taking place, and several times I heard the train driver saying 'all change' because a line had unexpectedly come to a premature end. I had to resort to getting out my paper map and working out an alternative route to my destination. The unexpected change of plan was a bit stressful, but I always got to where I needed to be in the end.

Three weeks ago, I finished my year of study at St Mellitus, which has left me thinking about what am I going to do with my time now that my weekly commitments have changed?

On my final day at college, I was asked to bring and share something that reflects the last year and my hopes for the future. I decided to bring in a



necklace with a cross that I received as a baptism present. At times this last year, I have felt very broken and worn out; this is reflected in my necklace chain as it's actually broken and can't be mended. The cross contained on it reminds me that Christ is with me. So, despite my necklace being unwearable and broken, it reminds me that Christ is always with me in the difficult and everchanging seasons we may face in life.

You may find it helpful to read Ecclesiastes 3 verse 1 - 8 and see what speaks to you most.
