ST DENYS CHURCH EVINGTON, BULLETIN Sunday 15th September 2024, 16th Sunday after Trinity

Dear Friends, this coming Sunday, many people across the nation will mark 'Battle of Britain Sunday' commemorating the great victory won by the Royal Air Force, which saved Britain from invasion in 1940. The enemy's object was to eliminate the Royal



Air Force, both in the air and on the ground, and to obtain air superiority for a seaborne and airborne invasion. At the beginning of the battle the Luftwaffe had no less than 2,790 aircraft to launch against England. To meet this aerial armada, Britain had less than 60 fighter squadrons, representing some 650 aircraft, and the ground staff had sometimes to work 16 hours a day to keep the machines in the air. Between 24 August and 6 September alone, Fighter Command lost 103 pilots killed and 128 seriously wounded, while 366 fighters had been put out of action.

The position was indeed grave. On Sunday 15 September came what Sir Winston Churchill called "one of the decisive battles of the war" and with it the Luftwaffe's greatest defeat. In Churchill's immortal words, "The gratitude of every home in our island, in our Empire, and indeed throughout the world, except in the abodes of the guilty, goes out to the British airmen who, undaunted by the odds, unwearied in their constant challenge and mortal danger, turned the tide of the world war by their prowess and their devotion. Never in the field of human conflict was so much owed by so many to so few."

In our personal prayers this Sunday, and throughout the week, may we give thanks to God for those who gave so much in the Battle of Britain, for the benefit of others, and for the freedom which was then preserved for us. With the passing of the years, let us pray that our liberties may be maintained and more widely shared; that people may be released from the tyrannies of mind and body which still enslave them: that the power and skill of the Royal Air Force may be used to safeguard justice and peace in the world: and that we ourselves lose not the vision of God's Kingdom and righteousness.

Hymn: 1. O Ruler of the earth and sky, be with our airmen when they fly; and keep them in thy loving care, amid the perils of the air. O let our cry come unto thee for those who fly o'er land and sea. 2. Strong son of man, save those who fly swiftwinged across the unchartered sky; each anxious hour and lonely flight serenely challenged, day and night. O'er land and ocean safely bear all those in peril in the air. 3. O Holy Spirit, God's own power, give peace in sudden danger's hour, bring calm of heart and be thou near, to those who watch and those who fear. To Thee will rise the grateful prayer, of those who serve thee in the air.
