Readings for today: James 3 vs 13—ch 4 v 3, 7-8a; Mark 9 vs 30-37

Dear Friends, what is your prayer life like? I must admit that for too much of my life I used prayer as a sort of emergency hotline. If there was a crisis or a need then I would pray, and, perhaps unsurprisingly, there was often a crisis or a need, so prayer was still very regular!

However, as I discerned for ministry, I was introduced to a new way of doing prayer. It was to have regular prayer, each day, and throughout each day, regardless of whether there was need or crisis, or even cause to say thank you or not. Just regular, routine prayer. In doing this it opened up a whole new aspect to my relationship with God. Just as being careful to communicate in any relationship nourishes and develops it, so our relationship with God grows and flourishes as we examine and communicate our inmost thoughts and feelings and listen in turn. Prayer is central to faith, and if we are serious about following Jesus then we will follow his example in praying to his Father. So, for me, prayer took on a new deeply fulfilling function as I opened up in vulnerability and trust to the one who has created me, who knows me and who loves me like no other.

However, despite this there are times when I worry that I can't quite find the right words to pray with and times when I feel self-conscious that a prayer won't meet someone's needs. I look with envy at those who have a great turn of phrase and confidence in their prayer. Then I remember the words from Matthew chapter 6 where we are reminded that prayer is not a public spectacle to show off with but rather, we are reminded to 'go into your room and shut the door and pray to your Father who is in secret...for your Father knows what you need before you ask him.' Even if we can't find the words, God knows our hearts.

As we go through a season of change at St. Denys, prayer is more important than ever. We need people who will lead us in simple, from the heart, public prayer. But we all need to be involved in an active prayer life; by ourselves and with each other.
