Dear Friends, a month ago, I was incredibly fortunate to spend two weeks on a cruise; what can I say other than wow! As a family we have never been away from home for anything longer than a week, so this was a real treat. We had the most amazing time away filled with lots of special memories, although there was one thing that happened which really made me to turn to prayer.

As our cruise was sailing between Africa and Spain, we came across a stranded small boat filled with nine migrants. The temperature was in the high thirty degrees and we couldn't see land in any direction – they were in trouble! A message came from the bridge; the captain announced we would be assisting in a rescue. It was absolutely heartbreaking to think these individuals had decided to leave their homes and risk everything to try and find a better life. This incident stuck with me throughout my holiday and made me reflect on what I would be prepared to do for my faith. I wonder how much risk you would be prepared to take.

Speaking to an officer a few days later, he told me it is unusual to rescue migrants on a cruise, and that we did so because it was likely that every other vessel had decided to ignore them; we were in a shipping lane surrounding by other boats, but they seemed to be more concerned with delivering their cargo on time.

The story of the Good Samaritan comes to mind, and I wonder today how much we are noticing the needs of others, whether they be within our church or those in our community? This week I'd like to encourage you to be like the people on the bridge; watch, and see what you notice. Are you prepared to take a risk because in doing so you could change someone's life? **Kimberley**
