Readings for <u>10am:</u> Hebrews 5 vs 1-10; Mark 10 vs 35-45; <u>4pm:</u> Joshua 14 vs 6-14; Matthew 12 vs 1-21

Dear Friends, I wonder when you were last really aware of God providing for your needs? I don't mean the generic idea that God meets the needs of those who trust in him (although that is true), but those times when life or circumstances occur in such a way that either a) you urgently need a miraculous provision or b) the ways that you have previously provided for yourself, perhaps through employment, are unexpectedly no longer there to provide the things that you need, and God meets your needs very clearly and specifically.

For the past few months, the second has been true for me. Some of you know that I unfairly had a job offer withdrawn in April. Since then, I have been applying for lots of jobs but have not yet had a job offer. Very frustrating, yet, in the midst of it, I have seen how God provides for my needs: Firstly, shortly after the job offer was withdrawn, I was finally awarded Personal Independence Payment, a non means tested benefit for those with disabilities. As well as helping financially, my award also means that I am eligible for a motability vehicle - I pick it up in a couple of weeks, with all the adaptions I need to do things independently, not just the ones I currently have which just let me drive the car. I could never afford those adaptions without PIP. Secondly, I was awarded a significant amount of compensation relating to offer withdrawal. The amount is enough to both cover the advance payment for my chosen car and adaptions, and to provide enough for me to live on whilst I apply for jobs, even though I didn't expect it to take this long when we agreed the compensation amount.

I've shared these stories to remind you of your own stories of God's provision. I'd like to encourage you to share **your stories** with one another, and with other friends who don't yet know Jesus, as a witness testimony to what God has done in your life.
