Language evolves over time and meanings of words change. The word 'Christian' is one such word, but we need to be careful about any misunderstandings that happen when change occurs. According to the Book of Acts, Christians were first called "Christians" at Antioch. The word applied to them by outsiders because they followed Jesus Christ. They thought that "Christ" was a name rather than a title. The word only occurs on two other occasions in the New Testament.

Do you think that the definition of a 'Christian' is someone who merely believes in God generally, lives their life in a good way, fitting in with what you would expect of a decent person in society, who may or may not go to church because it isn't a pre requisite to being a good person and incorporates all who are like this? Perhaps for you, being a Christian means taking the Bible literally, having commitment to the gifts of the Spirit and being traditional or 'old school' in your view of all matters moral? In this approach, you might think certain aspects of the Church of England over the past few decades has become too liberal, watering down the faith and holding the view of "moving with the times!" May be the word 'Christian' and following Christ to you is being baptised or christened (and there is a difference between the two!) into the church, whether it be the C of E or other denomination, a common view I suggest!

Whilst I contend that only God can and should decide who is a true follower of his, and who will ascend into heaven on judgement day, for me the only definition of a Christian is one who, imperfect though we all are as human beings, truly lives every day of our lives following in Jesus' footsteps to the best of our ability including nourishment through study of his word, the Bible. The Church's task, and ours as Christians, is to preach the Gospel in a way that is engaging and challenges us all at the deepest level and to welcome all, who, in the words of the Baptism service, "turn to Christ".

I challenge myself and all who read this – can we do infinitely better for Christ on a daily basis? You bet we can! We should definitely try! Blessings, **Qyan**
