ST DENYS CHURCH EVINGTON, BULLETIN Sunday 3rd November 2024, 4th Sunday before Advent, All Souls





Dear Friends, Ecclesiastes 3 reminds us that there "is a time for everything and a season for every activity under the heavens."

It then goes on to list many of these, including having "a time to plant and a time to uproot... a time to tear down and a time to build." To this list I wonder if we should add, 'a time to set down and a time to take up,' because I find that this feels like the season we are in now. After Christmas we will be relying on the support of visiting clergy to keep our services going and there is a time of evaluation needed to see what energy we have to keep doing as a church.

At such times, it is tempting to draw back and start looking inwards on ourselves. However, I would urge us not to get drawn into thinking in this way, as it is to outreach that we are called as a church. To remind us of those words of William Temple "The Church is the only institution that exists primarily for the benefit of those who are not its members." Rather than getting ourselves trapped into negative thinking, let us consider the things that are most important to do, as we continue to follow the two commandments that are greatest of all: to love God with all our heart, soul, mind, and strength and to love our neighbour as ourselves. We may well need to re-evaluate and set certain things down in our lives, however, it may also be that for some of us this will be a time to be called to take up new things in the church also. So let us not grow despondent but instead keep our eyes fixed on what Paul would refer to as "the goal."

This is certainly a time of evaluation and change, but, as we are faithful, it will also be a time of renewal too. Psalm 103 speaks of "our youth being renewed like an eagle's" And while I've never fully understood why eagles are singled out for their renewable youth, it is certainly true that as particularly long-lived birds they have a certain permanence and magnificence about them. It is also true that from their lofty heights they can review the wider picture as they seek out the energy of the thermals to follow. This may well be the season where we must do the same thing as a church, discerning where the energy lies. In doing so, perhaps some of us will be challenged to take up new things too! These are exciting times indeed!
