Change is often a daunting thing, but it also gives way to opportunities, and I hope we will all collectively remember this, whether we are negotiating life in a Minster Community or life on a Scottish island. God holds us all as we seek to serve him in all that we do.

So, for now it is time to say Goodbye, which is simply an ancient contraction of 'God be with you'. However, Goodbyes often anticipate meeting again in the future. I will certainly return to St. Denys to visit and always be grateful for the time I have spent here. With Every Blessing, **Mark**
