## ST DENYS CHURCH EVINGTON, BULLETIN Sunday 26th January 2025, 3rd Sunday of Epiphany

Dear Friends, last Sunday Revd Sunny opened to us the deeper meaning of the miracle at Cana, by reminding us that the Holy Spirit comes to us at times of need if only we will 'watch and pray', but (and there is always a but) when the Holy Spirit arrives we are called to respond with action, just like the servants at the wedding at Cana who responded unquestioningly to Jesus' curious instructions to refill the great water jars and then distribute the miraculously transformed contents to the thirsty guests. God provides the means; we must provide the hands.

This Sunday the season of Epiphany continues with St Luke's account of Jesus reading the scriptures at the synagogue in Nazareth to the astonished townsfolk who had only known him as the carpenter's son. Jesus reveals himself as 'the Anointed One', prophesied by Isaiah, upon whom 'the Spirit of the Lord' rests. Our Epistle continues Paul's urgent plea to the church at Corinth to find strength through a unity of purpose which can only be achieved by every member of the 'the body of Christ' unstintingly offering their unique skills. This reinforces another important message Revd Sunny offered us. As servants of God answering God's call, we must 'leave room for His grace' by acknowledging that alone we can achieve nothing, but together, by making a space for the Holy Spirit among us, and bringing our individual gifts to the table, we can fulfil God's will for the church; God's church...our church.

St Denys Evington is now moving into a new way of 'being church' where the role of each of us in responding to the call to Godly service will become ever more significant. Last week, Ann reminded us to be thankful for 'those who use their gifts to serve us all'. This week let us all take time to ask ourselves:

- What is the Holy Spirit calling us to do at St Denys?
- What gifts has God given to me?
- How can I offer them as part of the new way of 'being church'
