Readings for today: Exodus 34 vs 29-end; 2 Corinthians 3 v 12-ch 4 v 2; Luke 9 vs 28-36 [37-43a]

Dear Friends, while we have been in a period of vacancy without our own vicar or curate, we have been pleased to welcome a priest each Sunday to lead our Holy Communion service. Some we have known, like Sunny George who served as a curate at St Denys, and others we have not known so well or have met for the first time. Each one, however, has brought their own personality to St Denys and it has been a privilege to welcome them all.

We have also continued our Thursday morning services, sometimes with a priest to celebrate Holy Communion and sometimes with Geraldine who has led Morning Prayer. On a recent Thursday morning we were pleased to welcome and meet Rev Dr Vijay Kumar who came to celebrate Holy Communion with us. Vijay has come from Amritsar in North India, serving as a priest there, and has recently been appointed as Pioneer Priest in the parish of The Resurrection, Belgrave. He and his wife have only been in this country a couple of months and are waiting for their teenage son and daughter to join them when they get their visas.

Vijay preached on the Gospel story of the Stilling of the Storm, when the disciples were terrified that they were all going to drown. Jesus was with them in the boat sleeping, so the disciples immediately went to him and woke him up, saying 'Lord, save us for we are perishing!' Jesus commanded the wind and waves to cease and to the disciples' amazement the wind dropped, the sea became calm, and they were safe once again. They were safe because Jesus was in their boat. Vijay's message to us was that we all

have difficult times in our lives but if Jesus is in our boat He will protect us and guide us through the hard times, not promising us an easy life, but going through the bad times with us. In a powerful message Vijay prayed for us to have Jesus in our boat throughout our life.

Applications received after that date will not be entered on the new roll until after the Annual Parochial Church Meeting on $\mathbf{1}^{\text{st}}$ May.
