Dear Friends, "Let the peace of Christ rule in your hearts"

This is a passage we have been reflecting on as a family over the last couple of weeks. Phil has decided to start a business, I am now a couple of months into my new medication, and Ruby has now finished just over half of her GCSE exams.

We have a lot going on! Despite this however, we are all feeling Christ's peace - that is not to say life is all lovely, as we have our wobbles.

On the morning of Ruby's first exam, I went into her bedroom to wake her up and I found her cross necklace (see picture below) on her bedside table - it's normally put away safely - she tells me she needs some heavenly help to remain calm and often carries a holding cross to help her during exams. Throughout this intense time, Ruby has been calm and has prayed that God would guide her to the right answers. If you ask her, she will tell you God has certainly showed up!

In recent weeks I have had the privilege to journey with someone as they discovered they have a significant health concern, and to see how Christ's peace was indeed ruling their heart and mind as they found out what the medical staff plan to do. This person commented that sitting in church, in the quiet, gives them much needed peace; this is something I can relate to. I love being able to just sit in the quiet and admire the beauty of our church building, knowing so many prayers have been said there over the centuries.

I wonder if there are areas in your life that need Christ's peace? As it says in scripture, all you need to do is to ask him: And the peace of God, which surpasses all understanding, will you guide your hearts and your minds in Christ Jesus. (Philippians 4 vs 7); Let the peace of Christ rule in your hearts, since as members of one body you were called to peace. (Colossians 3 vs 15).

I also really appreciate the hymn 'In Christ alone', as I find that helps to draw me back to Christ. I pray that you feel an abundance of Christ's peace in whatever you are doing. **Kimberley**
