Readings for **15th:** Romans 5 vs 1-5; John 16 vs 12-15, **4pm:** Exodus 3 vs 1-15; John 3 vs 1-17, Readings for the **22nd:** Galatians 3 vs 23-end; Luke 8 vs 26-39

Trinity Sunday, observed the first Sunday after Pentecost in the Western Christian liturgical calendar, is a day dedicated to celebrating the Christian doctrine of the Trinity, which affirms the belief in one God who exists as three co-equal Persons: the Father, the Son (Jesus Christ), and the Holy Spirit. It's a time to reflect on the profound mystery of God and His relationship with humanity.

The concept of the Trinity is central to Christian faith, signifying that God is not a single, solitary entity but a dynamic, relational God who exists in three distinct yet inseparable Persons. The Father is the creator, the one who loves and sustains all things. The Son, Jesus Christ, is the incarnate Word, the means by which God revealed Himself to humanity. The Holy Spirit is the divine power, the life-giving force that empowers and guides believers.

Trinity Sunday provides an opportunity to deepen our understanding of this fundamental Christian truth. It's a time to ponder the intricate nature of God, to recognize His multifaceted presence in our lives, and to appreciate the interconnectedness of the three divine Persons. The celebration often includes special readings, hymns, and prayers that highlight the unique roles and attributes of each Person of the Trinity.

Beyond the theological significance, Trinity Sunday also serves as a reminder of the profound mystery of God's existence and the power of His love. It encourages Christians to embrace the paradox of the Trinity, acknowledging that we can never fully comprehend God's nature but are invited to encounter Him in faith and love.

In Winchcombe, as in Christian communities worldwide, Trinity Sunday marks a significant point in the liturgical year, prompting reflection, gratitude, and a renewed commitment to living out the Christian faith in light of the Holy Trinity. *Author unknown, sourced from the World Wide Web.*

A confirmed bachelor, and avid fan of cricket both as a player and spectator, a long term supporter of the Little Theatre in Leicester both as an actor and behind the scenes, and a Sunday School teacher for 15—20 years, Mike lived alone off East Park

Road in the family home for all of his life and taught at Whitehall Primary School in our parish for over five decades, continuing working one day a week there in retirement, only stopping due to ill health quite recently.

He attended St. James the Greater Church on London Road, Leicester for at least 60 years and was churchwarden there more than once.

In Revd Anthony's time at St. Denys, he would join us for the monthly pub night in the Cedars, Evington with his friend and former St. Denys attendee Bill Mann. They rarely missed these occasions.

Extremely intelligent, kind and gentle, with a smart and enjoyable sense of humour, he touched the lives of all he met in a most profound way. He will be extremely, deeply missed. Definitely a local legend! May he rest in peace, and rise in glory! Funeral details will be published when known.
