Readings for today: Colossians 1 vs 1-14; Luke 10 vs 25-37

Dear Friends

We have recently been to two family celebrations, the first a relative's Golden Wedding and the following weekend the marriage of our niece which was held in beautiful surroundings in the Peak District countryside near Chesterfield. Both were very enjoyable and happy occasions giving us an opportunity to meet up with family and, in the case of the wedding, to get to know people we hadn't met before. We also have members of St Denys family, Sian and Zak and Qyan and Kay, preparing to celebrate their own weddings in the near future. We wish both couples a very happy day.

In St John's gospel we read the story of the Wedding in Cana where Jesus performed His first miracle. Jesus was there, along with Mary, His mother. As the celebration was taking place the wine ran out, which would have been a disaster for the organisers. Hospitality was extremely important in that culture and the young couple getting married would have been shamed by not being able to serve their guests as would be expected. Mary told Jesus that the wine had run out, but he replied, 'Woman what has that to do with me? My time has not yet come'. Mary then told the servants to do whatever Jesus told them, and after the servants had filled the jars with water they served some to the master, who found that the water had been changed to wine, and in fact, very good wine.

This story of the wedding at Cana teaches us that God works in the ordinary events of life as well as the extraordinary and we need to trust in God's timing. We need to share His compassion and care for others as Jesus did for the people at the wedding.




Revd Canon Matthew Bradbury seen here meeting the then Prince, now His Majesty King Charles, in the Ely diocese in 2018.
