Readings for today: Colossians 1 vs 15-28; Luke 10 vs 38-end

## Dear Friends

Last week's readings for Morning Prayer include passages from the Old Testament book of Job. Job is not for the fainthearted as it is based on the premise that even the most faithful and devout people sometimes feel they are tested by God to the very point where their faith is destroyed. Job is a 'good man' whose comfortable world is shattered by a series of appalling tragedies. He laments his fate at length, accompanied by three companions who try to comfort him, but their words seem hollow, even patronizing. Job responds to their platitudes by asking how we can possibly understand the reasons why the Almighty and Just God has created a world where suffering afflicts the righteous as well as the wicked. At one point Job likens the search for such all-seeing wisdom to the work of miners, digging deep into the rock for gold and precious stones; but even there, he says, wisdom is not to be found. 'Where then does wisdom come from, and where is the place of understanding?' he demands. And then from his place of despair he utters these words: 'Truly the fear of the Lord, that is wisdom; and to depart from evil is understanding'.

We have just lost a dear old friend, John Penny, who was a vicar in Cambridgeshire for many years, and Rural Dean in Wisbech Lynn Marshland before I succeeded him. He suffered for many years with Parkinson's Disease, which progressively limited his faculties and opportunities in what would otherwise have been the golden years of his life. Nonetheless he remained the gentlest, kindest and most forbearing man. I never knew him utter a cross word or complain about anything or anyone, and in his last years, wheelchair bound, he always greeted people with a radiant smile and genuine affection. He made our lives better just by his presence. He didn't go in for complicated theology or showy sermons; he just loved people as God loved (and still loves) him. 'Fear of the Lord' is not a cringing, anxious, or timid posture, but a deep and unshakable respect for God's absolute lordship of our 'estate'; our lives and limbs, all that we love, everything we do and accomplish. In its valiant surrender we may find the quiet eye of the storm, the fixed point in a world of restless movement, like the stillness at the centre of a spinning top.
