## ST DENYS CHURCH EVINGTON, BULLETIN Sunday 27th July 2025, 6th Sunday after Trinity





Readings for today: Colossians 2 vs 6-15 [16-19]; Luke 11 vs 1-13

Friends, our gospel reading this week on Sunday, Luke 11:1-13, is about Jesus teaching his disciples of the power and importance of persistent prayer. He encourages them, and us, to ask, seek, and knock with unwavering faith, reminding us that our Heavenly Father delights in giving good gifts, even the Holy Spirit, to those who ask.

The passage begins with one of Jesus' disciples asking Jesus to teach them how to pray, as John the Baptist had taught his disciples. Jesus responds by teaching what is now known as the Lord's Prayer, a model for approaching God with reverence, acknowledging His holiness, and requesting His provision and forgiveness. This prayer emphasizes our dependence on God and our desire for His will to be done on earth as it is in heaven.

Beyond the specific words, Jesus emphasizes the attitude of prayer. He uses the analogy of a friend asking another for bread in the middle of the night, highlighting the persistence and boldness with which we should approach God. Even if our requests are not immediately granted, Jesus encourages us to continue asking, seeking, and knocking, trusting that God, in His wisdom and love, knows what is best.

Jesus assures his followers that God is not like the reluctant friend, but rather, a loving Father who delights in giving good things to his children. He specifically mentions the gift of the Holy Spirit, urging us to ask for this transformative gift, which empowers us to live lives pleasing to God. Therefore, let us approach God with confidence, asking, seeking, and knocking, knowing that our Father hears our prayers and will respond according to His perfect will.

Prayer can be challenging. However, if we focus our mindset totally on Jesus, our prayer lives will only grow and become effective, for his and our sake and those whom we meet day by day. **Qyan** (fulfilling a 'Guest' vacancy on the rota)
