## ST DENYS CHURCH EVINGTON, BULLETIN Sunday 3rd August 2025, 7th Sunday after Trinity





Dear Friends, last Sunday we had the pleasure of hearing Dr
Kumar's wise and witty words from the pulpit, reminding us that
prayer only becomes truly meaningful if we are *rooted* in Christ. Anything which
grows in the ground needs to be properly rooted in order to thrive, grow, flourish
and bear fruit. Being rooted in Christ is about persistence in prayer, even when
prayer seems not to bear fruit. Those of us fortunate enough to have gardens,
especially those who are attempting to raise new plants, know that the roots need
three things to survive: good nourishing soil, the right amount of moisture and
freedom from pest.

Sarah and I brought nine roses with us from Wisbech (once renowned for its rose nurseries). Knowing our time at the vicarage was limited, we put them into large pots, which was fine for the first few years, but when it came to the move to Leicester, they had become rather sickly. I discovered that most of our garden is heavily clay-bound; the clay was so thick that I had to dig it over several times. It was really hard work, removing great slabs of clay and then digging in 'clay breaker' and a soil improver as well as plenty of compost.

The cost and effort were considerable. I am however pleased to report that after a winter and spring of toil the roses have bloomed; they have never looked happier or healthier, with glossy leaves and abundant blooms. And, of course, now I remember that roses are quite happy in clay, provided you can get them started. But they still need a well-prepared loam above the clay in order to retain the right amount of moisture to keep them healthy. Good topsoil will also help to prevent disease by ensuring that there is a proper balance of minerals, nutrients and fauna.

If we are to succeed in prayer; if it is to become strong, lush and fruitful, it must be well-rooted and well-tended. We must work to find a regular pattern of prayer: this is the hardest part by far, just like taking a fork to the heavy clay-bound soil. Once we have established a pattern, we must persist in the discipline of hoeing and weeding to remove the distractions and vanities which can allow prayer to run wild and become nothing more than a shopping list of fond personal wishes. But if it remains *rooted in Christ*, in his teaching and his nourishment of word and worship, prayer will deepen its roots in our lives, allowing The Lord of the Harvest to enrich our minds and bodies with His presence, His grace and His blessings.


