ST DENYS CHURCH EVINGTON, BULLETIN 6th July, 3rd Sunday after Trinity





Readings for today: Galatians 6 vs [1-6] 7-16; Luke 10 vs 1-11, 16-20

Dear Friends, the churches in any Church of England diocese in the UK are grouped together in sections to form a number of different deaneries. St. Denys is part of the Leicester *city* deanery and it is a legal requirement that meetings, called 'synods', are held a minimum of twice a year. Often these can be interesting occasions.

Last Wednesday evening (2nd) in Christ Church, Thurnby Lodge, an 'open' meeting was held to include all congregations, not just the deanery synod representatives, of which I am one for St. Denys. (I did notify you all of this meeting in an e-mail a few weeks a go!!) The theme of the meeting was 'Healing Ministry' within the church particularly for clergy and lay workers!

Declining numbers of people in church services over past decades, even more so since Covid, means all the work that is necessary to run a church, falls on fewer and fewer people, mostly volunteers. Clergy and Lay Ministers are often to be found rushing around trying to ensure the many tasks are done and this becomes a habit, growing in enormity, often with little being achieved in the long run and focus on quality ministry and meeting individual needs, lost. This can quickly lead to exhaustion and burn-out which can take at least a year to recover from.

The meeting gave real examples of this happening. In essence, to avoid it, quite regularly, we should conduct self assessments to establish where we are at and be kind to ourselves. Ask yourself, what resources you? What drains you? Identify your areas of weakness, respect resources, notice situations and circumstances around you, discern what is right for you to be effective in ministry, don't neglect your spiritual life.

I would contend that all of us, whether working or retired, lead very busy lives. A lot of the practical advice above can apply to everyone, not just those in leadership roles within the church. We all need such 'creative repair' in our lives from time to time. In the strength of God whom we serve and worship, so be it. Amen. **Qyan**
