Readings for today: Psalm 91; Matthew 5 vs 1-12

Dear Friends, Remembrance is a time of mixed feelings for many of us. It is a time when Sarah and I remember especially her Grandfather, Tom Brown, who drove an open-topped scout car all the way from Normandy to Luneburg, (via Bergen Belsen shortly after it had been liberated). I was sixteen, courting Sarah, when he told me his recollections of those days. They are too painful to relate here.

Tom would never have called himself a hero: he hated the war and all it meant for his generation. When he and 'his lads' came back home they voted for change: they hoped the grinding poverty and huge social inequalities of the 1930s would become mere history, along with the hatred, racism and extremism which those things bred.

Here is a poem written by a friend, which expresses some of those conflicted emotions. **Matthew Bradbury**

They also serve who only stand and wait. A Railway Porter's War:

They say 'they also serve who only stand and wait'

I served my country at the platform gate.

Our lads went off, their Mums and sisters wept,

While I the midnight blitzkrieg watches kept.

The trains brought back the wounded, corpses too.

I helped unload them, best as I could do.

The moaning, bandaged faces made me want to curse,

but lifting silent coffins was much worse.

The trains went off again, to whistle shrill,

With many foreign lads this time, to fill

the waiting boats and barges standing by

to take them off to Normandy, to die.¹

Canadians, Africans, Indians and Yanks,
to man the landing craft and crew the tanks.
It was a world-wide task to crush the evil snake
which grew from Satan's heart to spread his vile hate.

From doodle bugs we were now taking cover;
we prayed this horrid war would soon be over.
We paid a dreadful price to stop the killing;
if only now to strive for peace would people be more willing.

When it was done, we hoped for peace, and more;
for something good to follow that damned war.
For better housing, healthcare free at source,
for pensions and a better life—for everyone, of course.

And now we're gone they wave the flag and say
that things are 'so much worse than in Dad's Day'
it seems they blame the foreigners for all their woes,
but foreigners who fought and died for us were not our foes.

I was a simple railwayman who watched and waited,
while the war brought slaughter unabated;
what I saw then made me wish this world a kinder place
where everyone would love each other, no matter what their colour or race.
