**Dear Friends,** at our Christmas midnight service, I called to mind that, for Christians, this night marked the *beginning* of the season of Christmas and Epiphany, rather than the 'last gasp' of that time of extended revelry and over-consumption which marks the secular season. While the people 'out there' are turning their attention to New Year sales and slimming aids, we should remain focussed on the presence of Our Lord among us, revealed to us as the Prince of Peace and the Hope of the World. Jesus calls us to turn away from all that is dark and strive for all that brings light and hope. Using the turn of the year as symbol for turning once again to the light might seem to support the secular notion of New Year's resolutions, but I am not a fan of this idea. Welcoming the Christ child into our lives should not be a once-a-year event, marked with 'pie crust promises' (as Mary Poppins would say). Although Baby Jesus is soon to be packed away with the Christmas decorations, if we will allow him, Jesus of Nazareth will remain with us every day for our whole lives. Even if turning to Christ every day (in prayer and promise) is something which most of us struggle to do, *every Sunday and every Thursday of the year* at St Denys offers an opportunity to hear the Word, to pray with friends, to receive the blessing of Christian fellowship and to make those little 'course corrections' which help to keep us all travelling towards the Light. At St Denys, we are still supported by a goodly crowd of people, but 'none of us are getting any younger' as they say.

I was struck by an item on the local TV news just before Christmas lamenting the impending closure of churches in Lincoln Diocese. The two vicars who were interviewed were making the point that the church can no longer afford to pay for more than a fraction of the clergy needed to lead services. Well, here's the news: services don't strictly need clergy! They just need enough committed people to provide a core of believers who can pay the bills and encourage just a few of their number to stand at the front and lead worship. ***Continued overleaf.....***

People who don't come to church, or who only do so at Christmas, are often the first to complain when their local church is threatened with closure. Why do churches close? The reason is simple: people are not attending them in sufficient numbers. Is this because they are weary of The Church of England, or is it because they have stopped listening to God? Do they worship at other churches, or do they worship at the secular altars of consumerism and celebrity? Is it because they are so caught up in the web of those silky spiders of debt and over-work, that they cannot break free. My plea to you this year is to help St Denys to buck the trend. Be a bit counter-cultural (Jesus certainly was). Keep coming and do so regularly. Bring a friend or neighbour. Don't let the dreary whirring world distract you from the quiet joy and stillness of the Nativity and the promise of His Presence among us, which is for all year, for all time, and for everyone.
