Sunday 30th November 2025, First Sunday of Advent



Dear Friends, this Sunday is Advent Sunday, the start of the four weeks when we prepare for the birth of Jesus our Saviour. This Christian festival has almost been taken over by the commercialisation of Christmas, with baubles and sparkle, gift ideas and special offers starting as early as September or even earlier. It is a busy time when many people get stressed and heave a sigh of relief when Christmas Day finally arrives and no more shopping can be done.

As Christians we also sometimes get stressed, but we need to remember what our preparations are for. We are preparing to celebrate the birth of a baby in a stable in Bethlehem to a young woman named Mary, a baby named Jesus who will become the Saviour of the world. We need to take time away from the hustle and bustle of shopping, cooking and wrapping of parcels, which use up so much energy in the run up to Christmas, to stop, look and listen.

At St Denys there are many opportunities to do this. If you would like a quiet time to stop, do call into church for our Blue Christmas held twice on Saturday mornings in December, the first on Saturday 6th from 10am to 12 noon.

On Saturday and Sunday 13th and 14th December we have our Christmas Tree Festival, an opportunity to stop to look and admire the decorated trees and chat with people over refreshments in the Parish Centre.

There are opportunities to stop and listen, and of course join in, at our Carol Singing at the Cow and Plough on Wednesday 17th December at 7pm and also at our traditional Carol Service on Sunday 21st December at 6pm which is always very popular.

On Christmas Eve at 4pm we have our Crib and Christingle service and when we have finished all our preparations we can come and worship the new- born King at our Midnight service or on Christmas morning.

Do enjoy the baubles and sparkle, the joy of buying gifts, but also take time to remember the true meaning of Christmas and use the opportunities at St Denys to help you to stop, look and listen.
