Readings for today: Acts 10 vs 34-43; Matthew 3 vs 13-end



Dear Friends, Firstly I would like to wish you all a Happy New Year. It is now a year since we had a priest attached to St Denys and over the last year we have had many special events and have received rich blessings from God. I pray that we will go forward into 2026 with thankfulness, optimism and hope for the future, because whatever the New Year brings we can be assured that God will continue to bless us, both individually and as a church.

In the first week of December, a friend and I went to Curve Theatre for a wonderful production of The Sound of Music. Other people from St Denys went to it too. The whole show was a delight, the singing, the dancing, the scenery and especially the children. The musical is based on the story of Maria who wanted to become a nun, but struggled with the strict rules of silence and obedience and was considered to be a problem to the other nuns who called her 'a flibbertigibbet, a will o' the wisp, a clown'. Eventually Reverend Mother realises Maria is not ready to take her vows and sends her away to become a governess to the Von Trapp family's seven children.

One of my Christmas presents was very much linked to this show. Quite unexpectedly I was given a book entitled 'The Sound of Musings' in which the author shows a deeper dimension to the life of Maria, encouraging us to look at her life and link it with our Christian lives in many different ways. When Maria was told she must leave the convent to become a governess she found it a life-changing challenge and we are reminded in 'The Sound of Musings' of Peter stepping out of the boat when Jesus challenged him. We sometimes need to 'step out of the boat' and take on something new and, perhaps, unknown, that we cannot do without God's help. A final prayer from the book:

Dear Lord, help me to trust that when you call, you will equip. Please help me recognise, respond and be ready when you call. Amen.


