Sunday 1st February 2026, Presentation of Christ in the Temple (Candlemas)



Readings for today: Hebrews 2 vs 14-end; Luke 2 vs 22-40

Dear Friends, a brief exposition of the theme for Sunday's service:

The Presentation of Christ in the Temple, celebrated on February 2nd, and also known as Candlemas, occurs forty days after Christmas, marking the formal end of the Christmas-Epiphany season. This feast commemorates the obedience of Mary and Joseph to the sacred laws and rituals of Judaism, which, in their time, required the purification of the mother and the presentation of the firstborn son in the Temple in Jerusalem.

According to the Gospel of Luke (2:22-40), the Holy Family journeyed to the Temple to offer a sacrifice of two turtle doves or pigeons, a gesture signalling their poverty and humility. Yet, this simple event is filled with profound theological significance, acting as a bridge between Christ's birth and the upcoming Passion. While at the temple, they met Simeon, a righteous man to whom the Holy Spirit had revealed he would not die before seeing the Messiah. Taking the infant Jesus in his arms, Simeon recognized Him as the "Light to lighten the Gentiles" and the "glory of Israel".

Simeon's prophetic song, the *Nunc Dimittis*, ("Lord, now lettest thou thy servant depart in peace") has echoed through centuries of Christian worship. However, Simeon also offered a sobering prophecy to Mary, stating that the child was destined for the "falling and rising of many" and that a "sword will pierce your own soul too," foreshadowing the suffering of the Crucifixion.

Alongside Simeon, the prophetess Anna, a woman of great age who worshipped with fasting and prayer daily, also recognized the child and spoke of Him to all awaiting redemption.

The feast is also known as Candlemas, or the "Feast of the Candles," because of the traditional blessing of candles for use in the church throughout the year. These candles symbolize Jesus as the "Light of the World". This celebration, with roots tracing back to the 4th-century Jerusalem church, is a joyful yet contemplative moment. It celebrates the Incarnation while preparing believers to enter the journey towards Lent and Easter, highlighting the themes of dedication, light, and prophetic fulfilment.
